

The Town of Strathmore's budget covers all the essential services that residents use each and every day. Whether you're diving into the Aquatic Centre, borrowing a book from the Strathmore Municipal Library, having your garbage or compost picked up, drinking clean water from the tap, riding the handibus on a road, or having emergency services rush to your aid – you're using a Town of Strathmore service.

The Capital and Operating Budget is the plan for how tax dollars and other funding will be invested. This year's \$44,718,700 total budget equates to a 5.6 per cent levy increase over the 2023 budget. In relation to a typical home assessed at \$428,700 in Strathmore, this would roughly equal a property tax increase of \$203.00 per year, \$16.92 per month, or an average weekly increase of only \$3.90 towards the services Strathmore residents rely on each day.



APR 13, 2023	Council adopts their Strategic Plan
JUN 12, 2023	Council budget package workshops begin
OCT 23, 2023	Community Groups present funding requests to Council
NOV 01, 2023	Administration presents the 2024 proposed Operating and Capital Budget
NOV 07, 2023	Council hosts a "Budget Cafe" and invites the public to engage and provide feedback
NOV 16, 2023	Budget deliberation meetings begin
DEC 06, 2023	2024 budget is passed by council
